Upcoming Election Schedules

Polling Places open at 7:00 am and close at 8:00 pm.

2026

Caucus - January 17th @ 1:00pm

Spring Primary - February 17, 2026

(narrows down candidates for April ballot, if needed)

Spring Election - April 7, 2026

Contests on the Ballot include: Justice of the Supreme Court, Court of Appeals Judge-District 4, Town of Jamestown Supervisor (2) seats, Cuba City & or Southwestern School District School Board Members and Grant County Supervisors.

Partisan Primary - August 11, 2026

(nominates state party candidates for Wisconsin's November ballot)

(does not include Independent candidates)

General Election - November 3, 2026

Contests on the Ballot include: Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Representative in Congress District 3, State Senator District 17, Representative to the Assembly District 49, Grant County Sheriff, Grant County Coroner, and Grant County Clerk of Circuit Court.

Spring Primary

Primary held on the third Tuesday (if needed) in February to nominate non-partisan candidates to be voted for at the Spring Election.

State Statute 5.02(22)

Spring Election

Election held on the first Tuesday in April to elect judicial, educational, and municipal officers, and non-partisan county officers, and to express preferences for the person to be the presidential candidate for each party in presidential election years.

State Statute 5.02(21)

Fall Primary

Primary held in even-numbered years on the second Tuesday in August, to nominate candidates to be voted for at the General Election, and to determine which candidates for state offices other than district attorney may participate in the Wisconsin election campaign fund.

State Statute 5.02(12s)

General Election

Election held in even-numbered years on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November to elect United States senators, representatives to congress, presidential electors, state senators, representatives to the assembly, district attorneys, state officers other than the state superintendent and judicial officers, and county officers other than supervisors and county executives.
